California's economy will decline further if we do not fix the state's water infrastructure. Most of Southern California's water supplies come from two imported sources – the Sacramento San Joaquin Bay Delta in Northern California and the Colorado River.




The Delta is the lifeline of our state. It provides water to farming communities in the Central Valley, the heart of our agricultural economy, and cities throughout Southern California. This vital water supply is threatened. Pumping Delta water has been restricted to protect endangered habitat and water yield has declined due to drought conditions. Factor in annual cost increases, land subsidence, population growth, rising sea levels and inevitable earthquakes that could destroy the weak levees along the river and you have a formula for a disastrous economy. In addition, access to Colorado River water is also diminishing as six other western states compete for that water, drawing more of it to meet their own growing populations.

The O.C. Water Summit is an innovative, interactive forum that not only tackles these issues, but sets real solutions into motion. The event brings together more than 600 Southern California business professionals with water industry stakeholders, elected officials, environmentalists, scientists and community leaders to discuss ongoing state water issues and how water supply challenges impact our economy and public safety. Solutions are discussed, challenged and more importantly set into motion by Southern California water agencies, businesses and cities. Panelists include international, national and state policy makers, journalists, economists, environmentalists and water industry experts.
