Module Overview: Course covers Command and General staff roles, major incident management, Unified and Area Command. Also addresses CA Mutual Aid and coordination between the field, local and operational area EOC/COCs. The course emphasizes large-scale organizational development; operational, logistical and fiscal considerations on an incident, the planning process and Incident Action Plans. (ICS Modules 7-11), (ICS Modules 12-17)

Pre-Prerequisite: SEMS/NIMS Combination, ICS-200

Target Audience: Support, supervisory or management personnel who, as part of their job duties, expertise or special assignment, will likely respond to an incident or event, and be expected to will likely respond to an incident or event, and be expected to supervise Branches, Divisions, Groups or Units; members of the Command Staff; and those who work in multi-agency coordination systems.
