

Orange County First Responders Participate in ICS-300 Training

The Water Emergency Response
Organization of Orange County
(WEROC), a program administered by the
Municipal Water District of Orange
County, recently facilitated a three-day
Incident Command System (ICS) 300
training course for 30 first responders
primarily from Orange County water and
wastewater agencies. The course provided
an in-depth focus on the National Incident
Management System (NIMS) ICS, and
included a variety of exercises to better
prepare participants to tackle the
challenges of the next disaster that affects

Orange County.

WEROC secured the course at no cost through a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) grant administered by the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services. Training was hosted at El Toro Water District, and was led by two experienced instructors from the Texas A&M Engineering Extension under the FEMA program.

WEROC supports countywide emergency preparedness, planning, response, and recovery efforts among water and wastewater utilities, and will continue to offer valuable training opportunities to its' member agencies. An ICS-400 course is tentatively scheduled for July 2020.
