Population growth, and the need for infrastructure to sustain it, transformed once biodiverse wetlands into a fragile system that has impacted local wildlife and human inhabitants alike. Federal, state, local, and environmental organizations have been squaring off for decades over how to manage the Delta, all while native fish species teeter on the brink of extinction, and even the wettest years see limited water exports for agriculture and human needs. Today, Delta stakeholders race to make voluntary agreements, finding common ground so fish, farm, and folk can coexist in support of California's trillion-dollar economy.
