
Valley District – Met Mutual Aid & Transfer

- San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District
 - State Water Contractor 102,600 AF Table A
 - San Bernardino Basin Area
 - Santa Ana River Watershed
- Past Litigation
- 2000 Coordinated Operating Agreement
 - Mutual Aid Helped fill DVL with 600,000 AF
 - Water Transfer 200,000 AF
 - Expired 2016

 - Valley District














History

- 2014-2015 Concept discussions began and grant application for Prop. 84 submitted
- 2016 DWR awarded grant in 2016 /grantee (SAWPA) and sub-agreements executed
- 2016 Developed Decision Support Model for Water Banking Scenarios
- 2016 Initiated Discussions with Met on Operational Term Sheet
- 2017 Project implementation started



Santa Ana River Conservation & Conjunctive Use Program

2017-2019 - Continued discussion with Met staff on Draft Operational

Multi-Benefit, Multi-Use Program

The Program includes 3 main elements:

- Water Use Efficiency: Turf Removal & Conservation-Based Rates
 - 7,439 AFY projected water savings
- Watershed-Scale Cooperative
 Water Banking Program
 - SARCCUP-Met Member Agency-Met agreement is focused on the groundwater banking component
- Habitat Creation & Arundo Removal
 - 800 acres of Arundo removal/3,000 AF of conserved water projected









SARCCUP – Water Banking Program Component

Objectives


- Bank imported water in wet-years
- Enhance water supply reliability
- Increase available dry-year supplies in the Santa Ana River Watershed
- Provide an Extraordinary Supply benefit during MWD Allocation Plan

Facilities

- Watershed-scale program; multiple locations
- Coordinated operations

Funding

• \$150 million plus program (\$55 million in grant funding)





SARCCUP 30,000 Foot View



- Valley Offers Water to MET
- Met Sets Purchase Amount
- 50% Available to "SARCCUP Member Agencies"
 - Eastern
 - Western
 - **▲ IEUA**
 - MWDOC (OCWD)
- Equal Allocation unless Unanimous Agreement
- Extraordinary Supply (or Not)
- Multiple Put & Take Scenarios

EXAMPLE TRANSFER

- **32,000** acre feet MET Purchase
- 16,000 AF SARCCUP Member Agencies
 - **♦** Eastern − 4,000 AF
 - ♦ Western 4,000 AF
 - **♦ IEUA − 4,000 AF**
 - **♦** MWDOC (OCWD) − 4,000 AF

SARCCUP Agreements

- Past
- Future
 - Extraordinary Supply Benefit Allocation Agreement
 (Met, MWDOC, OCWD, Anaheim, Fullerton & Santa Ana)
 - **♦ SARCCUP Operating Agreement**(Valley, Eastern, Western, OCWD (the Operating Committee), IEUA & MWDOC)

 - Met-Valley Agreement



Met-MA SARCCUP Agreement

(Agreement Among the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California, Eastern Municipal Water District, Inland Empire Utilities Agency, Municipal Water District of Orange County, and Western Municipal Water District Regarding the Santa Ana River Conservation and Conjunctive Use Program)

SARCCUP Issues

Met-MA SARCCUP Agreement





"The agreement among the Operating Committee members, MWDOC and IEUA shall also include provisions consistent with the terms of this Agreement for the potential purchase of SARCCUP Program Water by MWDOC or IEUA or both that is not purchased by the Operating Committee members."

Excess Water Purchase

"The agreement among the Operating Committee members, MWDOC and IEUA shall also include provisions consistent withthe terms of this Agreement for the potential purchase of SARCCUP Program Water by MWDOC or IEUA or both that is not purchased by the Operating Committee members."



"It is the request of the Municipal Water District of Orange County(MWDOC) that the parties memorialize concepts and provisions that have been agreed to during the draft document development and commit to their inclusion in the final, future operating agreements."

- Not looking for ownership of project assets or groundwater rights
- Understand that any use of system infrastructure will require compensation
- Understand that any Storage Agreement will require compensation

"Terms of this Agreement"

- Use of SARCCUP Water
 - Santa Ana Watershed vs. MET Service Area
- Storage & Recovery of SARCCUP Water
 - Stored within Santa Ana Basin (including Valley)
 - Delivery by Exchange with MET or through local SARCCUP facilities
- Sale of SARCCUP Water is by MET to the SARCCUP Member Agencies
- Price of SARCCUP Water is "Metropolitan's rate for full service untreated or full service treated water in effect at the time of the sale"
- MET Allocation of SARCCUP Water
 - MET will allocate equally to those SARCCUP Member Agencies requesting water at least 50% of the amount that MET purchases from Valley District during a calendar year
 - "provided that those SARCCUP Member Agencies requesting water may modify the allocation by unanimous written agreement among themselves."



32 TAF Example Transfer



♦ Valley offers 32 TAF & MET Purchases = 16 TAF SARCCUP Member Agencies

Summary Points

- Seeking documentation of previous agreed terms
- Not seeking free use of infrastructure or water rights
- Does require storage but not necessarily in the OC basin
- MWDOC may never exercise the option to purchase excess water
 - If Valley makes water available
 - If MET purchases water
 - If the other SARCCUP Member Agencies don't purchase their allocation
 - If MWDOC obtains storage
 - If these conditions yield a reasonable benefit for the costs and risks
 - If MWDOC South County MAs see value in the program
- MWDOC has an obligation to represent the interests of all our MAs
- Confident that we will reach agreement among the agencies
