DISCUSSION ITEMS

DISCUSSION WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM MWDOC'S MEMBER AGENCIES REGARDING KEY REGIONAL ISSUES AND KEY ORANGE COUNTY ISSUES, INCLUDING THE MWDOC BUDGET AND PROPOSED ACTIVITIES FOR FY 2021-22, THE MWDOC RATE STUDY, REGIONAL WATER ISSUES, AND WATER USE EFFICIENCY ACTIVITIES

Yorba Linda Water District

President Tamaribuchi stated that the evening would consist of short presentations, each followed by open dialogue/questions between the Board and audience. The following topics were covered:

- FY 2021-22 Budget and Activities (R. Hunter)
- Conservation Framework & Call to Action (J. Berg and H. Baez)
- Water Supply Conditions & Reliability Activities (H. De La Torre)

General Manager Hunter began the evening with a presentation and overview of MWDOC's FY 2021-22 proposed budget. Considerable discussion was held regarding the District's Reserve Policy, whether to amend it, and whether to use reserves for the South Emergency Operations site.

Director Chuck Gibson (SMWD) and OCWD General Manager Mike Markus advised that their agencies submitted comment letters regarding the budget and asked for written

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responses to the letters; the Board generally concurred that written responses to the letters would be provided.

Director of Water Use Efficiency, Joe Berg, and Government Affairs Manager Heather Baez, began their presentation with an overview of 2018 legislation relating to conservation measures namely, SB 606 and AB 1668 (Urban Water Use Objective Compliance) relative to indoor and outdoor water use.

Mr. Berg and Ms. Baez then provided an overview of proposed legislation, AB 1434 (Indoor Residential Water Use), as well as MWDOC's opposition to AB 1434, noting that it would establish a new indoor standard for water use, would circumvent the agreed upon language and data driven collaborative process enacted by AB 1668/SB 606, and would adversely impact water and wastewater management, including potable reuse, wastewater, recycled and reuse systems, infrastructure, operation and supplies. MWDOC's agencies were asked to join MWDOC in its opposition to AB 1434, or join the coalition letter in opposition. Discussion was held regarding wastewater challenges, cost effectiveness, and how little is gained from AB 1434.

Assistant General Manager Harvey De La Torre, completed the presentations with an overview of water supply conditions and water reliability activities. His presentation included information regarding the current drought conditions, Northern California Accumulated precipitation (and historical comparison), the State Water Project Table "A" allocation of 5%, MET's estimated water storage amounts, the Delta Conveyance Project activities, Colorado River Aqueduct activities, the Regional Recycled Water Project, MET's Integrated Resources Plan (update/process), status of MET's General Manager recruitment process, MET's Rate Refinement Process, the adoption of the 2020 Urban Water Management Plan, and MET's employee issues (internal investigation). Discussion ensued regarding salinity control issues out of the Colorado River, drought conditions and the reduction in the Table "A" allocation to 5%, the importance of the State Water Project and Delta Conveyance, and the potential importance of desalination for the region's supply reliability.
