#### COSTA MESA SANITARY DISTRICT

The Costa Mesa Sanitary District (CMSD) was incorporated in 1944 to provide solid waste disposal services to approximately 4,700 residents in unincorporated Costa Mesa (Costa Mesa became a city in 1953). Seventy-nine years later, CMSD provides solid waste and wastewater collection services to over 118,000 people living in the City of Costa Mesa and portions of Newport Beach and unincorporated Orange County. CMSD is responsible for maintaining 224.2 miles of sewer mainline, 4,707 manholes, 20 lifts stations and transports 8.4 million gallons a day to treatment facilities belonging to Orange County Sanitation District. CMSD contracts residential solid waste collections with CR&R Environmental Services where over 23,000 households are served. CMSD does more than just collect and transport solid waste and wastewater, as described below:

- Large Item Collection Program Three complementary pickups per year, with a limit of 10 items per pickup.
- **Door-to-Door Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection** Residents can have unwanted paint, antifreeze, batteries, motor oil, pesticide, etc. picked up at their doorstep.
- Residential FOG Recycling Program Residents can pour their cooking oil in one of two
  grease vats at Orange Coast College Recycling Center where the grease is collected and
  recycled into reusable products.
- Eco Expo A free educational event hosted by CMSD; residents learn about sustainability best practices. Attendees walk away with tips, tricks, and free tools to reduce their household waste.
- Sewer Inspection Rebate Program CMSD offers rebates to eligible residents who perform a closed-circuit television video (CCTV) of their sewer lateral or install a clean-out. Rebates range from \$200 to \$500.
- **Shredding and Compost Giveaway Event** Residents can drop off up to five standard file boxes of paper per household and receive two, 30-pound bags of compost.
- Sustainability Star Program CMSD highlights residents for practicing and exemplifying sustainability practices. Each quarter, CMSD selects a Sustainability Star and awards them a prize along with being featured in CMSD's newsletter and social media.
- Christmas Tree Recycling CMSD's contractor, CR&R, collects and recycles Christmas trees for several weeks following Christmas. The trees are converted into compost and Renewable Natural Gas by using anaerobic digestion technology.
- **GoCMSD Smart Phone App** Residents can connect directly with CMSD to report an issue fast with GoCMSD! The app is free to the public.
- Alkaline Battery Recycling Contest In an effort to educate local students about the importance of protecting the environment, CMSD sponsors an annual Alkaline Battery Recycling Contest among local schools. The school that collects the most batteries receive \$1,200 from CMSD. The school that comes in 2<sup>nd</sup> place receives \$1,000 and \$800 is awarded to the school in 3<sup>rd</sup> place. 4<sup>th</sup> place and beyond ranges from \$500 to \$100.

#### **EAST ORANGE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT**

The East Orange County Water District was formed in 1961 (under County Water District Law, Section 30,000; et seq.) to provide water imported to the 10 square mile area within its boundaries. The District presently serves wholesale water to a population estimated at 100,000 located in the central foothill area of Orange County approximately 30 miles south of the City of Los Angeles. The District also provides retail water service to approximately 5,000 residents of unincorporated area within its service area.

#### WHOLESALE OPERATIONS

The Wholesale District reservoirs and pipeline transmission systems annually deliver an average of 6 million gallons of water per day to five sub-agencies: 1) City of Tustin 2) Golden State Water Company 3) City of Orange 4) Irvine Ranch Water District and 5) the District's own Retail Zone customers. All of the sub-agencies use groundwater to supplement the imported water.

#### **RETAIL OPERATIONS**

In 1985, the District was approached by the County of Orange to take over the operation of their small Retail Water Works System #8. This transfer was completed in July 1985, and the now renamed "Retail Zone" moved the District into the field of retail water operations (supplying water directly to the consumer).

The East Orange County Water District Retail Zone covers an area of about 600 acres in unincorporated Orange County between the cities of Orange and Tustin. As of 2012, the District serves a population of about 5,000 through a system of 1,209 service connections. Average annual water use for the past eight years is about 800,000 gallons per year.

#### **WASTEWATER OPERATIONS**

In 2016, the District took over operations of OC San's Area 7 Local Sewer System. The sewer system encompasses about 7,700 acres and includes portions of the City of Orange, the City of Tustin and unincorporated communities of Lemon Heights, North Tustin, Cowan Heights, and Panorama Heights. The system serves an estimated population of 81,000 people.

#### **GENERAL**

The governing body of the EOCWD is comprised of an elected five member Board of Directors. The registered voters in the District elect board members at large for alternating four-year terms. The Board of Directors appoints a General Manager to direct the operations of the Wholesale and Retail Zone systems.

#### **EL TORO WATER DISTRICT**

The El Toro Water District (ETWD) was formed on September 26, 1960 by the landowners of the District under the laws applicable to California Water Districts (Division 13, Section 34000 et seq. of the Water Code of the State of California). In the past, the District served as a public wholesale water agency providing water for agriculture and ranching purposes in addition to supplying one privately owned retail water and sewer company. In September 1983, ETWD purchased the assets of the privately owned utility to become a retail water and sewer service provider.

ETWD provides water, sewer and recycled water service to the community, which encompasses all of the City of Laguna Woods and portions of the cities of Mission Viejo, Laguna Hills, Aliso Viejo and Lake Forest. An approximate population of 48,000 resides within 24,600 dwelling units, which, are served through 10,000 service connections. The District's total annual water demand is 10,000 acre feet. Annually approximately 9,500 acre-feet of potable water is provided through the District's 8,285 residential and 1,220 commercial, irrigation, industrial and institutional service connections. The District's Wastewater Recycling Plant treats, on average, 3.6 million gallons per day of tributary wastewater and currently recycles 1,500 acre feet per year for beneficial reuse.

#### **IRVINE RANCH WATER DISTRICT**

The Irvine Ranch Water District, established in 1961, provides high-quality drinking water, reliable wastewater management, ground-breaking recycled water programs, and environmentally-sound urban runoff treatment to more than 390,000 residents in Central Orange County. IRWD encompasses approximately 181 square miles extending from the Pacific Coast to the foothills, and serves the city of Irvine and portions of Costa Mesa, Lake Forest, Newport Beach, Orange, Tustin and several unincorporated areas of Orange County.

IRWD continuously strives to achieve greater customer satisfaction, increased reliability and resource conservation, and to build excellent relationships within the community. As an independent special district, organized under the California Water District Code, IRWD is governed by a five member, publicly elected board of directors.

#### Water Supply Portfolio

IRWD manages a diverse water supply which ensures reliable supplies during times of drought, regulatory constraints and emergencies, that helps to keep rates low. The IRWD water supply comes from local groundwater, recycled water, imported water, and local surface water. IRWD is a leader in the area of recycled water, and meets roughly 27,000 acre-feet of the service area's water demands with recycled water. Every gallon of recycled water used results in a gallon of drinking water that can be saved for potable uses. Using recycled water extends drinking water supplies and reduces reliance on costly imported water supplies, helping to improve water supply reliability.

#### IRWD uses recycled water for:

- Agricultural and landscape irrigation including parks, school grounds, golf courses, freeway landscaping and common areas managed by homeowner associations
- Landscape irrigation on large residential lots
- Industrial purposes such as concrete mixing and cooling towers
- More than 60 dual-plumbed office buildings

## Water Use Efficiency

IRWD also offers cutting-edge conservation and water use efficiency programs so customers have the tools needed to use water wisely. The District employs a unique allocation-based billing structure that rewards customers for conserving water. Since its implementation in 1991, the allocation-based rate structure has help IRWD customers increase their water use efficiency. The result is that over the last twenty years, IRWD customers have significantly reduced their average daily water use.

#### **MESA WATER DISTRICT**

Founded on January 1, 1960, Mesa Water District (Mesa Water®) is an AAA-rated independent special district that provides high-quality, affordable, safe water to 108,000 customers in an 18-square-mile area in Orange County, Calif. Mesa Water® serves most of Costa Mesa, parts of Newport Beach, and some unincorporated areas of Orange County including John Wayne Airport, with water that meets or surpasses all Federal and State drinking water regulations.

Due to the District's improved Mesa Water Reliability Facility (MWRF) – which returned to service in 2012 – Mesa Water® meets 100 percent of its community's water needs with locally-sourced water as the main supply, and imported water as the backup supply. This is unique for water providers in Orange County and Southern California, and ensures drought- resilience for Mesa Water's service area for the next hundred years or more.

With over 24,000 service connections and approximately 350 miles of pipeline, Mesa Water® delivers approximately 17,500 AF/YR, with potable water produced from groundwater wells and non-potable (recycled) water purchased from the Orange County Water District (OCWD). Mesa Water® also has the option of purchasing potable water from the Municipal Water District of Orange County (MWDOC).

Mesa Water's revenues result solely from its activities as a water utility; no tax revenues of any kind are received. Mesa Water® is also one of the more <u>operationally efficient</u> public water agencies in Orange County, based on expenditures per capita.

Mesa Water® practices perpetual infrastructure renewal and replacement which has resulted in the District achieving one of the lowest rates of water loss among North American water systems. By offering voluntary water use efficiency programs and water awareness education and outreach, Mesa Water® has already met the 20x2020 water conservation mandate.

Mesa Water® is governed by a publicly elected five-member <u>Board of Directors</u> whose members serve overlapping four-year terms. Each director represents one of five geographic Mesa Water divisions of approximately equal population.

Mesa Water's Board elects one of its members to serve as <u>President</u>, and another to serve as <u>Vice President</u>. The Board also appoints the <u>General Manager</u>, District Secretary, and District Treasurer. The General Manager is responsible for the day-to-day operations and administration, in accordance with the Board's policies.

Mesa Water® recruits and retains highly experienced, talented employees committed to professional excellence in performing their work for the District. Mesa Water® provides excellent customer service with 90 percent approval rating, from customers who know the District as their water provider, according to a recent <u>survey</u>.

#### **MOULTON NIGUEL WATER DISTRICT**

In 1960, the land encompassed by the Moulton Niguel Water District held a total population of eight. The prudent landowners found their sparse underground water supply depleting and, foreseeing the dramatic changes in development in store for their agricultural lands, formed Moulton Niguel Water District as a California Water Districton November 16, 1960. Then, in 1961, the District entered into several agreements with surrounding water agencies to bring a reliable supply of water to the area.

The District joined other surrounding districts to participate in the construction of an additional source of treated water, the Diemer Intertie (Allen-McColloch Pipeline), in 1981. Today, Moulton Niguel Water District is able to serve the water and wastewater needs of residents within Laguna Niguel and portions of the Aliso Viejo, Mission Viejo, Laguna Hills, and Dana Point areas.

From an original population of eight, the District currently services more than 170,000 residents by means of an elaborate system consisting of over 54,000 potable water connections, 39 pump stations, 28 potable water reservoirs storing a combined capacity of 72 million gallons of water, and over 700 miles of potable water pipelines.

The Board of Directors of the District elected to become a major participant in the Joint Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant, located in Laguna Niguel, where wastewater is recycled for irrigation purposes and for use in open areas such as golf courses, parks and slopes. The District maintains 148 miles of recycled water pipelines and 12 recycled water reservoirs. In addition to the potable and recycled water pipelines and facilities, the District also maintains 537 miles of sewer pipelines, and over 50,000 sewer service connections.

#### MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT OF ORANGE COUNTY

The Municipal Water District of Orange County (MWDOC) is a wholesale water supplier and resource planning agency. Our efforts focus on sound planning and appropriate investments in water supply development, water use efficiency, public information, legislative advocacy, water education, and emergency preparedness. MWDOC's service area covers all of Orange County, with the exception of the cities of Anaheim, Fullerton, and Santa Ana. The district serves Orange County through 27 retail water agencies.

Local water supplies meet nearly half of Orange County's total water demand. To meet the remaining demand, MWDOC purchases imported water – from northern California and the Colorado River – through the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (Metropolitan). They deliver this water to its 28 client agencies, who provide retail water services to the public.

The Municipal Water District of Orange County is committed to providing a reliable supply of high quality water for Orange County. Working closely with Metropolitan and client agencies, the staff looks for opportunities to improve Orange County's water resources and reliability. By integrating local planning challenges and regional stakeholder partnerships, MWDOC maximizes water system reliability and overall system efficiencies. The district works to expand Orange County's water supply portfolio by providing planning and local resource development in the areas of recycled water, groundwater, ocean water, and conservation. One example of these efforts is the South Orange Coastal Ocean Desalination Project, which seeks to develop south Orange County's local water supplies. Providing client agencies with value-added services, the district offers assistance on demand projections, mapping, urban water management planning, rate structure development, and water shortage mitigation plans.

MWDOC is governed by a seven-member Board of Directors. Each director is elected by the public to represent a specific portion of Orange County. MWDOC also appoints four representatives to advocate the interests of Orange County on the Metropolitan Board. MWDOC is the third largest Metropolitan member agency and holds key leadership positions on the Board of Directors that oversee policy development, strategy, and implementation.

#### ROSSMOOR COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT

#### **HISTORY:**

In the early 1980s the County was faced with a sizeable deficit in County Service Area 21. Rossmoor had three choices: Cut services, consolidate CSA 21 with other CSAs in the county, or form an independent CSD for Rossmoor. After considerable study by a citizens group, it was recommended that Rossmoor voters approve the formation of a Community Services District, which would be the most advantageous choice financially for Rossmoor. A Special District has many of the powers of a city with the notable exception of land-use planning.

The RCSD was formed in November 1986 as a result of a general election of Rossmoor voters to replace the Rossmoor County Service Area No. 21 (CSA 21). At that election, a majority of Rossmoor voters approved an order adopted on June 25, 1986 by the Board of Supervisors of Orange County to form the RCSD and concurrently dissolve the Rossmoor CSA 21, to establish that the boundaries of RCSD would be the entire territory of the unincorporated Rossmoor Community, that the RCSD would be the successor agency to the Rossmoor CSA 21 and take over the assets and assume all liabilities and obligations of the Rossmoor CSA 21, and to elect a five member Board of Directors for RCSD.

#### **POWERS GRANTED IN 1986:**

The Powers granted to the RCSD were: public recreation facilities and services, street lighting, road rights-of-way services, sewer services and, subject to the consent of the County of Orange, the collection and disposal of garbage or refuse matter. They included the specific services previously provided by Rossmoor CSA 21 which were: local park development and maintenance, road related landscape maintenance, street sweeping and community center/recreation programs. At that time, this included Rossmoor Park, the mini-parks and Montecito Center. In November 1990, the Rossmoor voters approved a ballot measure to acquire Rush School and surrounding grounds and to tax themselves to pay for one or more bonds to acquire the property.

Today, approximately 10,500 residents make their home in this unincorporated bedroom community located behind a signature brick wall situated between the cities of Seal Beach and Los Alamitos. The Special District of Rossmoor is governed by a five member Board of Directors, who are elected by the residents of Rossmoor and operates under the supervision of a General Manager. Rossmoor is known for its splendid urban forest, beautiful homes and strong family values.

#### **ROSSMOOR / LOS ALAMITOS AREA SEWER DISTRICT**

The Rossmoor / Los Alamitos Area Sewer District was founded in 1952 to provide wastewater collection and disposal in West Orange County. It is one of the area's oldest local governments. At the time, the community of Los Alamitos was unincorporated. The lack of a sewage collection system and local septic tank failures caused serious problems for residents and restricted development. A method had to be found to provide a public wastewater collection and disposal system.

By 1952, citizens in the area voted overwhelmingly in favor of bonds for construction of an adequate sewer system to replace the outdated septic tanks. Agreements were reached with other agencies to receive the Los Alamitos wastewater and treat it.

Major annexations made in 1954 and 1960 added the Rossmoor residential development and the nearby Naval Base.

Today the District services over 8,000 sewer connections. The 54-mile system covers over 4,000 acres and consists of pipelines ranging from 8-18 inches in diameter, installed along the public right-of-way. Major trunks run along Foster Road, Los Alamitos Boulevard, and Katella Avenue. The system discharges into the Orange County Sanitation District for treatment.

#### SANTA MARGARITA WATER DISTRICT

The Santa Margarita Water District (SMWD) was established in 1964 as a landowner district (Section 35306 of the California Water Code) by a group of ranchers who wanted to create a reliable source of water for their cattle. South Orange County was primarily rural then, and SMWD provided water to more cows than people.

Today, the District is the second-largest in Orange County, providing water and sewer service for more than 155,000 people who live in the City of Rancho Santa Margarita and the communities of Coto de Caza and Ladera Ranch as well as Talega in San Clemente and a portion of Mission Viejo. The District also serves the new communities of Rancho Mission Viejo.

Reorganized as a registered voter California Water District (California Water District legislation is Section 34000 of the California Water Code) in 1995, five Directors elected at large within SMWD boundaries govern the District. Over 50 years, SMWD has emerged as a leader in developing local reserves with the 244-million-gallon Upper Chiquita Reservoir, which is the largest domestic-water reservoir built in the region in 45 years.

Santa Margarita Water District is also enhancing its use of recycled and reclaimed water. The 1.3-billion-gallon Upper Oso Reservoir opened in 1979, and the District continues to move ahead with expansions to its recycled and reclaimed water efforts, from expanding production of tertiary water at the Chiquita Water Reclamation Plant, a 6 mgd facility, and with run-off detention basins such as Cañada Gobernadora Multipurpose Basin, a 30- acre detention basin completed in 2014 that is expected to collect 350 to 750 acre feet of runoff annually for reuse as irrigation water.

#### SERRANO WATER DISTRICT

The District services an area of approximately 3,000 acres which includes the city of Villa Park and a minor portion of the city of Orange. The number of domestic meters in service is approximately 2,250 with approximately 1,950 connections in Villa Park and approximately 300 connections in Orange. The population served by the District is approximately 6,165 in Villa Park and approximately 400 in Orange.

The District's principal source of water is native water drawn from Santiago Reservoir (Irvine Lake). Santiago Reservoir is supplied from a 44 square mile watershed. The District also has three operable water wells. The Walter E. Howiler, Jr. Water Treatment Plant was constructed in 1997. From the treatment plant, water is then pumped through the delivery pipe system. The District maintains generators at the treatment plant and at the Smith Reservoir which allow water to be supplied to customers in the event of power outage.

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#### SOUTH COAST WATER DISTRICT

On July 29, 1932, through the efforts of the first District Directors, Laguna Beach delivered water to the south coast area. In 1939, Laguna Beach's water supply from Huntington Beach wells became inadequate and it was critical that a "dependable" water supply be found. The solution was to join the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California. On July 15, 1942, Coastal Municipal Water District was formed and became the 14th member agency of the MWD. A large water line from Santa Ana was built at a cost of approximately \$1,130,000, and South Coast Water District had a "guaranteed" supply of water for the first time.

The South Laguna Sanitary District was organized in 1947 to develop a publicly-owned sewage collection, treatment and disposal system to replace individually-owned septic tanks.

In 1954, after a successful bond election of \$1,125,000, the area's first sewage system was installed, together with a small primary treatment plant. The treatment plant in Aliso Canyon was improved and expanded over the years and is now an integral part of the South Orange County Wastewater Authority comprised of ten agencies: El Toro Water District, Moulton Niguel Water District, the City of Laguna Beach, Emerald Bay Service District, Irvine Ranch Water District (formerly Los Alisos Water District), South Coast Water District, Santa Margarita Water District, City of San Juan Capistrano, City of San Clemente, and Trabuco Canyon Water District.

From the beginning, the Sanitary District shared office space and some personnel with the Water District. In the interest of economy and efficiency, the two districts merged in July 1976. At this time, the number of water board members was increased from five to seven, the Sanitary District was dissolved, and all of its plants and properties, together with its personnel, were absorbed by the South Coast Water District.

In July 1997, the District detached the residential area known as Laguna Sur and Monarch Point to the Moulton Niguel Water District. The District continues to provide sewer collection to those communities via contract with MNWD.

In January 1999, the District consolidated the Capistrano Beach Water District and dissolved the Dana Point Sanitary District, with South Coast becoming the legal successor to both. The Board of Directors was expanded to eleven (due to resignations was decreased to seven). In November 2000 the seven board of directors were elected by "division" and no longer at large.

In July 1999, the District detached the community of South Laguna to the City of Laguna Beach. By contract, the District continues to provide water, recycled water and wastewater collection services to this community.

In March 2000, the District became the contract operator of the Tri-Cities M.W.D. facilities, now known as the Joint Regional Water Supply System (JRWSS).

For the November 2002 election, the Board of Directors voted to reduce the Board to five members to be elected at large.
