PRESENTATION / DISCUSSION ITEMS

PRESENTATION ON THE STATE WATER PROJECT

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Ms. Nina Hawk, Metropolitan's Chief of Bay-Delta Resources, provided information on the Delta Conveyance Project (DCP). Her presentation included information regarding how the State Water Project (SWP) is a core component of MET's supply portfolio, an overview of SWP charges from 1963 through 2023, and how the SWP system hydrologic patterns are shifting with climate change. Ms. Hawk then provided an update on the DCP, including operational flexibility, high flow events amidst drought conditions, benefits for long term water supply, and continued planning efforts (funding, permitting, etc.), as well as key takeaways and next step efforts.

The Board and audience then discussed various topics with Ms. Hawk, including energy costs, continued anticipated participation in the DCP, potential permitting issues (under the new presidential administration), SWP charges and affordability, the Pure Water Southern California project, and whether the DCP should continue to be MET's priority project.

Following discussion, the Board thanked Ms. Hawk and received and filed the information.

ELECTION RESULTS SUMMARY

Director of Governmental Affairs Heather Baez provided an overview of Orange County's election results summary, highlighting that Directors Seckel and Thomas were both re-elected.

LEGISLATIVE ACTIVITIES

a. Federal Legislative Report (NRR)

Mr. Garrett Durst of NRR reviewed his written report, and he highlighted the election results for the Senate, the House of Representatives, and President, as well as the appropriations process. He also provided information on how a new presidential administration would affect water-related legislation.

The Board received and filed the report.

b. State Legislative Report (SDA)

Mr. Syrus Devers of SDA reviewed his report, highlighting the statewide election results, and any impacts to MWDOC. He noted the Chair seat is vacant for the Senate National Resources & Water Committee.

The Board received and filed the report.

c. Legal and Regulatory Report (Ackerman)

Mr. Dick Ackerman referenced his report and commented on a recent Politico article titled "Why the election might not matter for California water," noting that President-elect Trump and Gavin Newsom have similar views on California's water supplies. The Board received and filed the report.

d. County Legislative Report (Whittingham)

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Mr. Whittingham reviewed his written report with the Board and the Board received and filed the report.

Director Ackerman highlighted several MET activities including desert housing issues, water storage, Proposition 1 funding, water transfers, and Colorado River negotiations. She also reported that the Board extended General Manager Hagekhalil's leave of absence (as an investigation is ongoing).

Director Erdman advised that MET hosted an event at the Anaheim Marriott, titled "MET Works," which was held to introduce contractors on how to do business with MET.

Director Seckel highlighted MET's Finance and Asset Management Committee activities (specifically MET's low water sales and its effect on the budget).
