

- Green Acres Recycled Water






\$70M Capital Improvement Project

Mesa Water Reliability Facility (MWRF)




Benefits of Local Water:

Imported Water Use (1965-Present)






New Local Water Supply Feasibility Study:

"Local SIP"

- Received \$250,000
 WaterSMART Grant from US
 Bureau of Reclamation
- Participating agencies include Mesa Water District, Orange County Water District, City of Newport Beach and City of Huntington Beach
- Potential 5-8 mgd brackish groundwater desalination plant
- Local groundwater south of the Injection Barrier
